	CHED Tulong Dunong Scholarship Program	The Tulong Dunong is a grant-in-aid program under the Student Financial Assistance Program (StuFAP) of the Commission on Higher Education. This is intended for graduating high school students whose GWA is at least 80% in the third year and at least 80% in the first three grading periods of the fourth year. This program can be availed by students belonging to the following: persons with disabilities (PWDs), solo parents and their dependents, members of cultural minorities, members of the hill tribes and senior citizens, if qualified.
